



IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR ARIZONA

Grants to Arizona Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$14,150,118

Award Highlights:

- Latinos in Heritage Conservation is creating The Abuelas Project, which will identify, collect, and share stories about historic places or sites within Latinx communities nationwide.
- Arizona State University is creating a digital reference collection for La Quemada-Malpasso Valley. The project will provide digital access to approximately 4,000 resources resulting from the archaeological fieldwork at La Quemada, including notebooks, field reports, published findings, and maps, as well as datasets and images of the site's features, architecture, excavations, and artifacts.

NEH also provides annual funding to [Arizona Humanities](#), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Arizona Humanities Highlights:

- Arizona Humanities partnered with over 30 K-12 schools and organizations serving K-12 schools through the AZ Reads initiative to bring humanities-based literacy programs to thousands of students across Arizona. AZ Reads brought local authors and artists to schools, provided important program supplies, and purchased thousands of new books for classrooms and students.
- The virtual Climate Conversations series examines environmental challenges and climate change through the human experience. Participants from across the state learned about the intersection of the heat crisis and the housing crisis in Arizona, the history of forest management, and water scarcity in the Southwest.
