

## IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR LOUISIANA

## Award Highlights:

- A grant was awarded to the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Foundation, Inc. for the purpose
  of classifying and digitizing 806 audiovisual materials from the New Orleans Jazz & Heritage
  Festival Archives' Amy Nesbitt and Heritage Collections.
- A grant was awarded to Grambling State University to establish a one-year initiative that will
  create virtual reality experiences that highlight significant events that have occurred on the
  campus.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>Louisiana Humanities</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

## Recent Louisiana Humanities Highlights:

- Prime Time Boxes are a mobile version of Prime Time's in-person family reading program. They come with a number of kid-friendly activities, a Grown-up Guide to help parents talk to their kids about the books, and award-winning children's books to help them build their own home libraries. Over 150 families in the greater Shreveport area were among the 750 boxes of books that the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities gave to families throughout the state in the spring and summer of 2023.
- The Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities offers Emergency Mitigation and Preparedness
  Grants to support cultural nonprofit organizations in ongoing efforts to mitigate previous
  impacts from emergency events and prepare for future threats. Grants can be used for
  physical repairs, writing emergency plans, paying insurance storm deductibles, moving servers,
  and more.
