

## IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR MARYLAND

Grants to Maryland Organizations and Individuals for Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$16,571,433

## Total Number of Awards – 121

## Award Highlights:

- As part of the state's ongoing participation in the National Digital Newspaper Program (NDNP), the University of Maryland, College Park has been awarded funds to digitize 100,000 pages of Maryland newspapers published before 1963. The journals covering Prince George's County in the 1940s and 1950s, the Jewish Times, and publications from the colonial era and early nineteenth century would be the main focus of this phase.
- The Unity Productions Foundations received funds to launch a website, lectures, public forums, and educational resources pertaining to the history and culture of Muslims in America.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>Maryland Humanities</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Maryland Humanities Highlights:

• Maryland Humanities conducted a trial project to include English Language Learners in Maryland History Day. The premise that research, source analysis, argument development, and public speaking are all valuable abilities for all Marylanders serves as the foundation for this significant growth.
