

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR MICHIGAN

Grants to Michigan Organizations and Individuals for Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$ 21,690,098

Total Number of Awards – 119

Award Highlights:

- Funds were awarded to Central Michigan University to conduct research and create a book about Native American veterans, their families, and their communities in the years after the Civil War (1865–1920).
- Funds were awarded to Eastern Michigan University for a 2-week residential program for 25 high school and middle school teachers to learn about the history and influence of Northern civil rights and civic involvement in Detroit, Michigan.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>Michigan Humanities</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Michigan Humanities Highlights:

 Dialogues of War: Same Mission Many Stories. Students at two Michigan universities learned about the history of women veterans, how to host reflective conversations, and how to use humanities objects in a way to authentically center conversations and bring new life to museum collections. Six conversations with women veterans from across Michigan were hosted by the students and culminated with group conversations at the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency's Women Veteran's Conference in October 2023.
