

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR NEBRASKA

Grants to Nebraska Organizations and Individuals for Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$ 11,090,747

Total Number of Awards – 47

Award Highlights:

- Funds were awarded to fund a three-year inter-institutional project between Creighton University and Arizona State University to create a humanitarian and health pathways program.
- The University of Nebraska Board of Regents has received funding to prepare an online publication of the late-life writings and poems of Walt Whitman (1819-1892), including November Boughs and Good-Bye My Fancy.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>Nebraska Humanities</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Nebraska Humanities Highlights:

- 46 Prime Time Family Reading programs took place all across Nebraska in 2026. In one example, a new bilingual English/Spanish Prime Time Preschool program took place at the public library in Madison, Nebraska, in order to engage more of the town's Hispanic families with the library.
- The 2023 "What Connects Us" Chautauqua in Grand Island drew hundreds of Nebraskans who wanted to explore the compelling stories of historical figures including Rosa Parks, Mark Twain, Chief Standing Bear, and Edith Wharton.
