

## IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR NEW JERSEY

## Award Highlights:

- Elizabeth Skirnick, a public scholar, received funding to research and write a book about early 20th-century black educators who faced extraordinary obstacles after entering Harvard University as "special students" but continued to return to their communities to transform American education.
- Rowan University received funding to launch an 18-month project to develop African American
  history and culture curricula for undergraduate students and in-service teachers in local school
  districts.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>New Jersey Humanities</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent New Jersey Humanities Highlights:

- NJCH's 2023 work has included programs that deepen the sense of community and connection
  through our two cohort-based learning programs, <u>Community History</u> and <u>Humanities</u>
  <u>Lab</u>. These programs put the public humanities to work in service of various community-driven
  goals, and at the same time, they broadened the historical record and basis for empathy for
  all New Jerseyans, documenting the stories of people whose lives aren't widely visible.
- NJCH also expanded its collaborative work with community colleges, including the <u>Informed NJ Program</u>, which bolsters community-based journalism around the state. For this and other work, we were honored to receive the <u>Partner of the Year award from the New Jersey Council of County Colleges</u>.
