

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR NORTH DAKOTA

Grants to North Dakota Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Year 2019 through 2023 – \$6,157,585

Total Number of Awards - 13

Award Highlights:

- The Plains Art Museum (PAM) received a grant to enhance its ability to exhibit and develop its collection, better involve all humanities-related elements in their programs and exhibitions. As a result, they will be able to reach a more varied regional audience and establish an environment that is conducive to research by students from nearby colleges and universities.
- The University of North Dakota received a grant to support for the publication of "Religion, Race, and Immigration: How American Jews, Catholics, and Protestants Encountered Mass Immigration, 1882-1924." This publication will explore the experiences of Jewish, Catholic, and Protestant leaders and organizations in response to the mass immigration to the United States during the early 20th century.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>Humanities North Dakota</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent North Dakota Humanities Highlights:

- Through our high school curriculum, We the People: The Citizen & The Constitution, Humanities North Dakota (HND) teaches the next generation of citizens about their rights and duties. HND also offers interesting online courses in literature, philosophy, history, and other subjects, bringing academics and a community of lifelong learners together with rural dwellers.
- Humanities North Dakota also offers a range of programs throughout the year. Classes are two to ten-week online courses. Every session offers HND's core values: kindness, humility, good faith engagement, the free exchange of ideas, and intellectual curiosity.
