

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR OHIO

Grants to Ohio Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$17,375,690

Total Number of Awards – 118

Award Highlights:

- Baldwin Wallace University (BW) received a grant to develop a new minor in Medical and Health Humanities for undergraduate students from all majors. The goal is to connect students and faculty from BW's School of Humanities with those at the Schools of Social, Natural, and Health Sciences to improve skills like empathy, communication, and teamwork for future health professionals.
- The National Council for History Education received an NEH grant to conduct, jointly with the Astronauts Memorial Foundation at Kennedy Space Center, two week-long residential institutes for K-12 teachers. The institutes will explore the impact of our Space Coast on America's political, scientific, and cultural history.

NEH also provides annual funding to the <u>Ohio Humanities</u> Council, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Ohio Humanities (OH) Highlights:

- Sponsored The Lincoln School Story documentary, coming to PBS. The film details a group of Hillsboro Black mothers and children, who marched for school desegregation every day for two years in one of the longest sustained protests of the civil rights movement. OH, with Daydreamers Press, is creating a children's book through the eyes of one of the real marchers, Joyce Clemons, now 81.
- Supported Superman's Cleveland, a festival of workshops, book talks, film screenings, community conversations, and more, to celebrate the legacy and the 85th anniversary of the world's first comic superhero, invented in 1938 in the city's Glenville neighborhood.
