

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR OKLAHOMA

Grants to Oklahoma Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$14,297,837

Total Number of Awards – 45

Award Highlights:

- The University of Tulsa received a grant to create a Minor in Historical Trauma and Transformation. The goal of the program is to use hands-on archival materials and site visits to explore how historical trauma and the cultural response have shaped society.
- The University of Oklahoma received an NEH grant to plan a digital public platform that uses indigenous oral histories, music, and audiovisual materials. The Indigenous Media Portal will be curated in collaboration with Tribal heritage communities.

NEH also provides annual funding to <u>Oklahoma Humanities</u>, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Oklahoma Humanities (OH) Highlights:

- Funding to the Woodring Wall of Honor and Veterans Park supported the research, fabrication, and installation of an exhibition interpreting the significance of the iconic Huey Helicopter and the broader history of veterans in Oklahoma. The impressive exhibit consisted of an actual Huey helicopter, interpretive label copy, and educational resources.
- OH supported the research, fabrication, and installation of an outdoor earth exhibition interpreting the significance of the indigenous Moundbuilders culture. The striking earthen mounds surround the entire First Americans Museum complex. Serving over 150,000 people, this exhibit garners a global audience while telling local Oklahoma narratives.
