

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR SOUTH CAROLINA

Grants to South Carolina Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$10,825,273

Total Number of Awards – 55

Award Highlights:

- Coastal Carolina University received a grant to build an initiative expanding community-based storytelling into its humanities curriculum. The grant will go towards engaging with faculty to develop curriculum, work with storytelling and digital humanities centers nationwide for best practices, and develop an online databank for future projects.
- A professor at Clemson University received a summer stipend grant from NEH to write a groundbreaking work on the methods literary editors use to preserve the voice of authors without erasing the marks of their impairment or disability.

NEH also provides annual funding to <u>South Carolina Humanities</u>, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent South Carolina Humanities Highlights:

- Awarded a grant to the Columbia Museum of Art for a major 50-year anniversary exhibition titled "Resurgence and Renaissance: Art of the Catawba Nation Since 1973." The interpretive exhibit and dynamic programs reached numerous South Carolinians, including K-12 students and members of the Catawba nation.
- Supported the University of South Carolina's conference: "Wood Basket of the World: Lumbering, Manufacturing, and Conserving South Carolina's Forests." The conference convened scholars, industry professionals, and community members to share cutting-edge research on the history of lumber, wood products, and forest conservation and destruction.
