



IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR TEXAS

Grants to Texas Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$31,004,297

Total Number of Awards – 213

Award Highlights:

- With an NEH grant, the City of San Antonio will develop a climate heritage strategic plan to protect and preserve its historic properties to align with the city's existing municipal climate action and adaptation plans.
- The University of Houston was awarded an NEH grant to improve the digital infrastructure of its Recovering the US Hispanic Literary Heritage program and the hundreds of thousands of Latino texts it contains. The updated repository will hold the vast digital archives of manuscripts, correspondence, photographs, books, and memorabilia collected over the thirty years of the program's existence.

NEH also provides annual funding to [Humanities Texas](#) (HT), the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent HT Highlights:

- Supports teacher workshops to raise the quality of social studies and language arts instruction in Texas schools. Since 2004, 7,178 teachers in more than half of the state's school districts have participated, serving more than 500,000 Texas students each year.
- Funds traveling exhibitions on a variety of historical and cultural topics that appeal to institutions of all sizes and budgets, from small community centers with volunteer support to museums with professional curatorial staff. Since 1973, the program has displayed exhibitions in more than 800 Texas venues, many of them in small, rural communities.
