

IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS FOR WISCONSIN

Grants to Wisconsin Organizations and Individuals from Fiscal Years 2019 through 2023 – \$12,230,912

Total Number of Awards – 72

Award Highlights:

- Beloit College received an NEH grant to support development of online courses, scholarships, and fellowships to help with training of museum staff, especially from small institutions, in the care and conservation of the humanities collections throughout the country.
- The University of Wisconsin, Stout, partnering with Cultural Heritage Imaging and the Minneapolis Institute of Art, received an NEH grant to develop and implement cutting-edge computer graphics specifically developed to capture and display 3-D images of cultural heritage items.

NEH also provides annual funding to <u>Wisconsin Humanities</u>, the designated humanities council in the state, to support a wide array of public programming.

Recent Wisconsin Humanities Highlights:

- Funded projects that connect Wisconsinites to one another to help them face today's challenge.
 This included funding an interactive exhibit about the evolution of agriculture and the future of
 farming and funding for a film on the closure of the Uniroyal tire plant in Eau Claire and the
 community response.
- Continued growing its digital storytelling initiative, Love Wisconsin, with personal stories to
 encourage understanding and community building. Stories included Sofia, whose maternal
 grandfather came to the U.S. to work for the Ringling Brothers circus in Baraboo, and the Lac du
 Flambeau Veterans Center, renamed for Joni Brown Mathews, who was raised on the
 reservation and had a distinguished military career.
